

# Our November 2021 Newsletter



It has been a special and busy half term settling our new children at Nursery and welcoming back our older children. We have been learning lots about their interests and they have shown particular interest in imaginative play and outdoor play.

Autumn seemed to arrive very quickly, and the children have been taking part in lots of different Autumn activities. They loved going for walks in the 'big' garden where they could see the seasonal changes in our environment - our 'big' garden, with the numerous trees, is so beautiful at this time of year.

Our new 'Little Hands Library' has been working so well, with lots of children showing interest in this. Books can provide so many opportunities for learning and development.



We are implementing the library system using children's book bags. Once books are returned, then the children can choose a further book to take home. Should your child not bring a book home, please just mention this to a staff member.

### Environmental



We had a fantastic 'Recycle Week' last term. It was a great introduction to this subject with children learning about different materials such as what is plastic, paper, metal etc and what can be recycled.

We will now continue to promote this learning further in day-to-day practice and we would appreciate it if you could discuss this with your children at home too.

This term we have new, updated actions which are:-

Recycle - we will be looking at the recycling logos with children on packaging, establishing whether items can or cannot be recycled.

Reuse - we are going to continue to reuse any appropriate packaging, boxes, plastic bottles, etc, for children's creative activities. Our children love making musical instruments and very imaginative constructions with these!

Reduce - we are speaking to the children about the importance of turning taps off when they have washed their hands, so we are not wasting water.

### **Topics**

We have lots planned for the new term, we will keep you updated using the parent noticeboard or on Tapestry: -

Week Beginning 1st November - Firework Safety

Within this topic, there will be lots of creative opportunities to make firework pictures and we will be talking about the importance of safety with fireworks.

We are aware that some children do not like fireworks, and they can feel frightened, so we will also be exploring various emotions within this topic.

# Thursday 4th November - Diwali

We will be talking about the Hindu festival of Diwali - the festival of light. We are planning some creative activities, as well as having group time discussions. We also have some great books about this festival, which we will be reading and discussing with children.

# Week Beginning 8th November - Oral Hygiene

Oral hygiene is an area that we promote with our children whenever appropriate. Discussion about this can arise at anytime when we are playing with children but particularly at snack and lunchtime.

It is also an area that has recently been added to the curriculum of the new EYFS as a statutory requirement.

To promote this even further with the children, we are planning a particular week of fun activities and discussions. There is also a great song we will be sharing with the children - we will keep you updated closer to the time!

Week Beginning 15th November - Road Safety Week



We regularly speak with the children about the importance of road safety but the national campaign of 'Road Safety Week' is always a good opportunity to continue to promote this further.

During this week, we will be planning lots of different activities which will include imaginative role play, small world toys, creative activities, and stories.

# Week Beginning 29th November - Hanukkah and Christmas



We will begin this week talking about Hannukah - the Jewish Festival of Lights. This will be followed by our Christmas topic on the 1<sup>st</sup> of Dec. There will be lots of fun things planned for both!
